“According to researchers, children may observe and mimic parents’ discussion of worries. And when parents frequently provide verbal warnings, for example, “be careful,” children may anticipate danger and fear certain situations. Kids that had less of a say in whether or not they’d be attending summer camp, also demonstrated higher separation anxiety.”
